#### Teacher's Federation Stop Work Meeting -Thursday, 5th December

#### **Snack Packs**



#### **Under 12's Girls Cricket Championship**

On the 16 and 17 November, my family and I travelled 18 hours to Adelaide so I could compete in the School Sports Association Under 12's Cricket Championship. I was captaining NSW – what an amazing opportunity. To kick off the tournament, an opening ceremony was held at one of the grounds in central Adelaide. The following day, my team played two T20's. In the first game we played ACT and won quite easily chasing only 35 runs. Our second game was against WA, which we won again quite comfortably.

After a good nights sleep and drinking some hydrolyte, my team and I were ready for another great game. This time we played against a more challenging side - Queensland. This game was 35 overs each, so we only had to play one game a day. In the end, the game came down to the last ball where Queensland had to score about 3 to win; luckily we were up to the challenge and got a run-out. NSW won again!

The next day was an excursion day that made history by being one of the hottest days recorded in Adelaide, lucky us! Our team had a tour of the Adelaide oval and spent some time marveling in the SA museum. On Thursday, we played another 35 over match, this time against our hosts SA. We won pretty easily. So far NSW were undefeated and we had guaranteed our spot in the Grand Final!

Next day, we were up against the strongest team yet - Victoria. We batted first and only managed to score around 135 runs. It was Victoria's turn to try and chase down the runs, but in the end they couldn't. We bowled them out with about 20 runs short. What a great win! But it wasn't over yet, we still had to beat them yet again in the final, this time a more determined team who really wanted to win!

The final was being live streamed, which was pretty nerve wracking! I went in to do the toss and unfortunately lost so Victoria chose to have a bat first. What a start! It was a long 35 overs. Victoria batted quite well scoring 173 with one girl scoring 96. None of us were feeling confident as we walked off the field. But it wasn't over yet. It was now NSW's turn to bat and to try and chase down 173 runs. As our

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opening batters strode onto the field, I was feeling quite nervous. The overs lingered on and on, no wickets were lost yet and we even kept to our run target (5 runs an over.) In the end, I didn't even have to bat, nor did our number 3 batter. In the end we didn't even lose a wicket and we won with 2 overs to spare! NSW ran onto the field laughing and cheering! It was a great performance by our opening batters with one of them scoring 91. It was a great game. In the end it was a fun tournament going out unbeaten and achieving another win for NSW!


