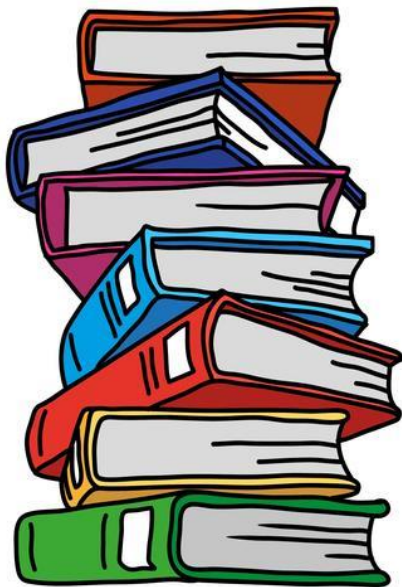

# Buckling Up on School Buses

## Details

Some school buses will look different now with the introduction of seat belts into Busways' fleet. By law, passengers in a seat belt-fitted vehicle must wear the seat belt. If your seat has a seat belt, you need to buckle up - the way you do while travelling in a car.

Each seat will have three seat belts so you get to share the seat with one or two of your friends! It's important that you clip in your seat belt without having to be asked by the bus driver as they need to focus on driving the vehicle safely.

By law, you won't be able to stand on the bus once yours has seat belts – you must sit in a seat and wear your seat belt correctly. Don't forget to 'click clack'.

Parents - It would be a great assistance if you can help by talking to your children about wearing their seat belts on the bus without waiting to be asked. It is just like getting in the car – if there is a seat belt on their seat, they need to buckle up.

# SCHOOL SAFETY NOTICE TO DRIVERS

In the interest of CHILD SAFETY there is NO EXCUSE for disobeying traffic control signs and Road Rules in the vicinity of a school. Please read and understand the following traffic controls around your school;

	<p><b>NO STOPPING</b></p> <p>Under no circumstances are you permitted to stop on a length of road to which a NO STOPPING sign applies.</p>	<p>Penalty: \$337.00 + 2 demerit points each time you disobey a NO STOPPING sign (school zone)</p>
	<p><b>NO PARKING</b></p> <p>You are permitted to stop in a NO PARKING zone only while you are engaged in dropping off or picking up passengers.</p> <p>You must not stop for more than two minutes. You must stay within three metres of your vehicle.</p>	<p>Penalty: \$187.00 + 2 demerit points) each time you disobey a NO PARKING SIGN (school zone).</p>
	<p><b>BUS ZONE</b></p> <p>You are not permitted to stop in a BUS ZONE unless you are driving a bus.</p>	<p>(Penalty: \$337.00 + 2 demerit points) each time you stop in a BUS ZONE (school zone).</p>
	<p><b>CHILDREN'S CROSSING</b></p> <p>You are not permitted to stop within 20 metres before the crossing and 10 metres after the crossing.</p>	<p>Penalty: \$448.00 + 2 demerit points each time you stop on/near a children's crossing (school zone).</p>
	<p><b>DOUBLE PARKING</b></p> <p>A driver must not stop on a road between the centre of the road and another vehicle that is parked at the side of the road.</p>	<p>Penalty: \$337.00 + 2 demerit points each time you double park (school zone).</p>
