Telegraph Point Public School - Enrolment Boundary

Every NSW Public School has an enrolment boundary to ensure all local students are able to enrol in their local school. The boundary for Telegraph Point Public School can be found using the Department of Education's <u>School Finder</u> site.

All NSW Government schools follow the Department's <u>General Enrolment Procedures which provide</u> information on the entitlements, requirements and procedures to enrol students.

Telegraph Point Public School has reached the school's enrolment buffer, this means we must hold our remaining spaces for local students.

We are currently unable to accept non-local enrolments. Families who do not reside within our boundary are strongly encouraged to visit their local public school for enrolment. All public schools are committed to providing exceptional outcomes for all students.

Kindergarten Enrolments

We are now taking Kindergarten enrolments for the 2021 educational year. If you are intending on enrolling your child next year please contact the school office.

Enrolments can be taken on line. The link to do this is

https://enrol.education.nsw.gov.au/#/?schoolCode=3176&catchmentLevel=primary.

When you follow the link scroll down a little bit to find the heading *Get started with your application*, then in the *enrolling for* box select 2021 (for kindergarten children starting school in 2021) Calendar Year, and then in the box underneath enter your address. This will bring up a box saying *Apply on Line*. Click that box and then you just complete information as requested.

When to start school

Your child can start Kindergarten at the beginning of the school year if they turn five on or before 31 July in that year. By law, all children must be enrolled in school by their sixth birthday.

Birthdays

At this stage no birthday cakes can be brought into the school during the current protocols. Your support with this is appreciated. Some of our families have brought ice blocks etc in, which are individually wrapped and meet protocols.

Uniform Shop

For school uniform needs please call the office and we will organise to get what you need and send it home with your child. Payment should be made, if possible online directly to the P&C account or alternatively by EFTPOS over the phone.

Communication

If you have an issue or concern please contact the classroom teacher, the Assistant Principal or myself. From time to time issues arise at school. This is perfectly normal for any school setting so if you have any questions, issues, enquiries or you want feedback on any aspect of your child's schooling please ring to make a mutually convenient appointment time with your child's teacher, Assistant Principal or myself.

A reminder that school starts back for the students in Years 1-6 on Wednesday 29 January. Kindergarten students start on Thursday 4 February.


