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



School grounds

Parents should not come onto the school site unless the reason is classified as essential, such as if your children are being dropped off to school late or picked up early. 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Tell Them From Me

Student Survey

This term our school will be participating in the second *Tell Them From Me* student survey. Consent forms with additional information were sent home earlier this week and operate through an opt out system. If you would not like your child to participate in this anonymous survey, please complete the consent form and return to school by **Friday 11**th **September (Week 8).**

Parent Survey

We will also be participating in the *Partners in Learning* parent survey, another part of the *Tell Them From Me* suite of surveys (student, teacher and parent surveys) on student engagement. The survey asks parents and carers questions about different factors that are known to impact on student wellbeing and engagement.

Running this survey will help our school understand parents' and carers' perspectives on their child's experience at school. These include: communication between parents/carers and staff, activities and practices at home and parent/carer views on the school's support of learning and behaviour. This valuable feedback will help our school make practical improvements.

The survey is conducted entirely online on smartphones, iPads, tablets, laptops or computers. The survey will typically take 15 minutes or less to complete and is completely confidential. The parent survey will be conducted over Term 3 and early Term 4. Although participating in the survey is entirely voluntary, your responses are very much appreciated.

Child Protection

This semester students will be involved in mandatory lessons around child protection. These curriculum lessons focus on ways to identify danger and keep safe, supporting students to lead healthy, safe and meaningful lives. Some of the content of the program deals with sensitive issues and may prompt students to ask you questions that can be uncomfortable. We encourage you to engage in these conversations with your child/children, as their most trusted parent or carer. If you have any questions about these mandatory child protection lessons, please contact the school via the office.

Parent Portal

A letter went home last term with the eldest student in each family in regards to a new initiative we are implementing into our school, the Parent Portal. The letter explains how to log into the Parent Portal using a unique access key for each family. Once you have logged in you will be able to see the school newsletter, review and update absent notifications and update personal information. If you have misplaced this letter or you didn't receive one please let the office know and we will generate another letter.

For the remainder of the year we will continue to use School Enews for our newsletters but this will be phased out in 2021.

Sibling photo envelopes are also available from the front office. Please note these are only for siblings who are current students of our school.
