Principal's Report

End of Year

What a year! After a disrupted 2021, we started off strong with many of our usual events recommencing, including the Swimming Carnival, Student Leadership Induction Ceremony, Intensive Swim Scheme, and for the first time we offered class orientation meetings for parents to meet their child/ren's teacher. On March 19 normality as we knew it ended and we began the journey to find our 'new normal' after the catastrophic flooding of Telegraph Point. Our students, families and community navigated a move to Hastings Secondary College (Westport Campus), including many students catching additional shuttle buses to make the journey. I would like to acknowledge every single member of the Telegraph Point Public School staff, who worked tirelessly to ensure this transition was as smooth as possible for our students, who remained our primary concern during this time of professional and personal upheaval.

With the complementary breakfasts and enormous daily step counts, we remember our six week stay at Hastings Secondary College fondly, but couldn't wait to return to our own school site mid-Term 2. Unfortunately, after only a few weeks we were faced with more disruption, in the form of renewed COVID-19 outbreaks and a return to remote learning. As has become synonymous with Telegraph Point Public School, we faced this adversity with resilience and determination. Teachers planned for continued educational delivery utilising online platforms and students tuned in to their classes from home. Again, I would like to acknowledge all teachers who went above and beyond to ensure that all students had access to high quality learning during this time. As a parent and an essential worker juggling work commitments and supporting my child through remote learning, I speak on behalf of parents everywhere when I say nobody was happier than parents to welcome students back onsite for the return of normal school operations.

Term 4 has seen continuing COVID-19 restrictions, which has impacted on our usual end of year activities. Acknowledging student success and farewelling our 2021 Year 6 class has been our first priority, negotiating the Department of Education guidelines to ensure Presentation Day and the Year 6 Farewell could both go ahead, albeit looking a little different than in the past! Thank you to Ms Hoelzl and Mr Fullbrook, our local cinematic visionaries, for ensuring the Presentation Day was recorded in high quality to share with our community. Class Report - 20 Mrs Owen



good laugh I am sure.






