Principals Report

The first major activity was the commencement of NAPLAN 2022. Cross Country

Last week saw 25 students from our school represent at the Lower North Coast Cross Country in Kempsey. Our students were met with a challenging sandy track at the racecourse on a warm sunny day. All students participated to the best of their ability and should be proud of their achievements.

Operational Art

Senior Visual Arts students from Hastings Secondary College, Westport Campus were welcomed to our school last Wednesday 11 May. They were tasked to assist with shortlisting student artworks to enter the Operation Art Competition. The artworks were about resilience and growth, this is a relevant topic for the students at Telegraph Point Public School after floods, bushfires and COVID have recently impacted their community.

This was a fantastic learning experience for the college students which required them to critically analyse the art pieces, consider if they fit the brief and collaborate regarding their final decision. The senior students were impressed with the quality of artwork at Telegraph Point Public School. They also enjoyed hearing the stories behind each creative work.

Minutes lost = days lost per year




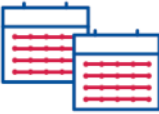
A couple of minutes here and there doesn't seem like much, but...

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Class Report - 5/6 Lime

An important aspect of our day in 5/6 Lime is daily fitness. Every morning we participate in a range of activities that include relays, shuttle runs, EMOMs (every minute on the minute) and climb the ladder (each minute adds repetitions until the activity can not be completed within the minute).
