Principals Report

Changes to COVID-19 restrictions and guidelines

First of all, I would like to extend a big thank you for your continuing efforts in supporting our school and students during the pandemic – especially prioritising safety and learning.

Yesterday the Premier and Minister for Education announced changes to school settings for the remainder of Term 1. These updated settings were developed in close consultation with NSW Health and key stakeholders to ensure schools are kept open for learning, while keeping up with changing community settings. The updated settings include:

RATS

The continued use of rapid antigen tests (RATs) for twice-weekly testing of students and staff until **Friday 25 February**.

From **Monday 28 February**, there will be a move to symptomatic testing. Tests are to be used at your discretion such as if your child is symptomatic or there are cases in their class. Our school will provide each student and staff member with 8 tests and these will be sent home with your child on **Friday 25th February** (unless you have contacted the school to request that they are not sent home). **This will be the last set of tests provided by the school.**

Masks

Masks will continue to be required indoors for all school staff, volunteers and visitors including parents and carers in primary schools until **Friday 4th March**. This means that from **Monday 7th March**, masks will no longer be mandatory for all staff. However, those who wish to continue to use them will be supported to do so.

Visitors

From **Monday 28th February**, visitors can be invited back on school sites for events, regardless of their vaccination status. We will continue to share information as we review activities such as assemblies and similar events. We will continue to use the core layered COVID-smart measures for minimising risk when planning activities and events. All visitors are asked to follow our usual sign-in and sign-out process.

Afternoon Routines

To ensure the safety of all students, including the large number of students who travel home from school on buses, we will continue to adhere to our established afternoon routine. We will assemble under the COLA at 2.55pm and dismiss students as their parents/guardians arrive to collect them at the school gate. This allows us to effectively supervise students still in our care until escorted onto buses or dismissed with their parents/guardians.

Our school will continue to ensure layered COVID-smart measures are in place, including vaccinations, maximising natural ventilation in learning spaces, continued good hand hygiene practices and enhanced cleaning.

LNC Swimming - Felicity G

Yesterday (Wednesday 24 February) Felicity G represented the Hastings Camden Haven PSSA district at the Lower North Coast Swimming Carnival, competing in the Senior Girls 50m Breaststroke. After numerous heats in this event, Felicity placed 4th overall, earning her place at the North Coast level. 



